ORDINANCE NO. 2020-03

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTRONIC REPORTING FOR OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF PAWN SHOPS AND PAWNBROKERS AND SCRAP METAL RECYCLERS AND DEALERS WITHIN THE CITY OF GLENWOOD, ARKANSAS; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF SUCH RULES, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES CONCERNING ELECTRONIC REPORTING.

WHEREAS, The City of Glenwood, Arkansas (the “City”) has determined that Ordinance 01-13 should be amended and that the City is in need of an electronic inventory tracking and reporting requirements by Owners and Operators of Pawn Shops and Pawnbrokers and Scrap Metal Recyclers and Dealers doing business in the City;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Glenwood, Pike County, Arkansas:

Section 1: Electronic Inventory Tracking by Owners or Operators of Pawn Shops/Pawnbrokers and Scrap Metal Recyclers or Dealers. Effective ninety (90) days after the adoption of this Ordinance, each and every owner or operator of a pawn shop or pawnbroker or a scrap metal recycler or dealer located or doing business in the City of Glenwood, Arkansas shall file daily electronic records of goods received/inventory or scrap metal purchases made that day by the end of the business day and into a database maintained by LEADS Online (Law Enforcement Automated Database Search), or similar database as designated by the Chief of Police.

Section 2: Failure on the part of any owner or operator of a pawn shop/pawnbroker or scrap metal recycler/dealer to comply with the provisions of this Section shall be deemed a misdemeanor.

Section 3: Upon conviction, the offender shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred & 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00) for each separate offense. Each day of noncompliance with this section shall be deemed a separate offense.

Section 4: Goods received/Inventory shall include but not be limited to electronic goods, firearms, hand tools, precious metals, or precious stones.

Section 5: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. The declaration of any part of this ordinance to be null and void shall not serve to void any other part of the ordinance.
